


St Margaret's Church of England Primary - Curriculum Overview - Autumn Term 1st half

<p>In English children will study 'The Journey by Francesca Senna. This is an award winning story of the journey of a refugee. Before writing their own story of a significant journey children will study a range of texts on the subject on refugees and consider symbols of freedom.</p> 	<p>This half term we will be exploring place value and number this will include learning about:</p> <p>Numbers to 10,000, 100,000, 1 million and 10 million, rounding numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000 and negative numbers.</p> <p>We will begin work on the four operations starting with addition and subtraction.</p>	<p>Using a novel about Space in guided reading, children will study a number of science topics.</p> <p>These will include: looking at an astronaut's diet and learning about the nutrients our bodies need; researching different planets – comparing them using the key components that make up a planet; studying adaptation and evolution.</p>	<p>Children will study a unit on pilgrimage: creating a map of the children's journey so far; writing an introduction to a 'Guidebook to Life'; 'mapping' the journey of a Christian; considering the journey of a 'Super Christian' and planning a pilgrimage for year one children. This work will be based on Christian pilgrimages but before half-term children will begin to look at pilgrimages in other religions.</p>
